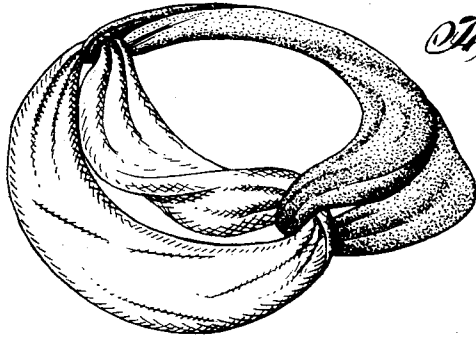

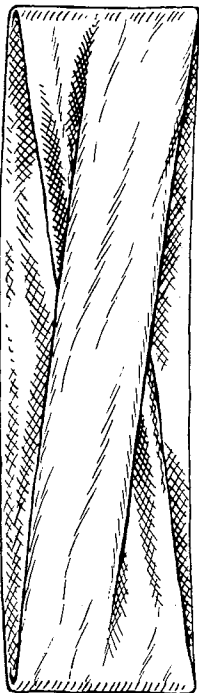
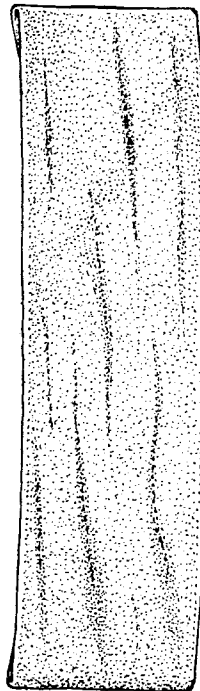

DESIGN FOR A SCARF OR SIMILAR ARTICLE

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that CHARLES JAMES, subject of the King of England, and resident of New York city, in the county of New York and State of New York, has invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Scarf or Similar Article, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof, in which,

Fig. 1 is a perspective view of a scarf or similar article embodying my new design;

Fig. 2 is another perspective view thereof;

Fig. 3 is a perspective view of one of the tubular rings showing one side thereof;

Fig. 4 is a perspective view of the other tubular ring showing the opposite side thereof.

My ornamental design consists of an article of apparel comprising two twisted tubular rings of cloth linked through each other, with half of each ring folded back upon the other half.

My article may be worn either as a scarf around the neck or as a head-band.

I claim:

The ornamental design for a scarf or similar article, substantially as shown and described.
